Workshop attended by 20 KS2 Primary Children from schools across BANES.


Report by Mocca Arapé




Result of ballot vote ‘What is the top way to stay mentally healthy?’
Winning topics: Keeping Active, Accepting who you are, Doing things you’re good at.


A selection of the feedback we received from the 'Where do you stand?' activity:




100% said helpful
